A NOTE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

On May 5-6th, five Grade 9 girls competed in the 2018 Technovation BC Regional Competition at Simon Fraser University. According to the organizers, Technovation is a program that, "offers girls around the world the opportunity to learn the skills they need to emerge as tech entrepreneurs and leaders. Every year we invite girls to identify a problem in their community, and then challenge them to solve it. Girls work in teams to build both a mobile app and a business plan to launch that app, supported by mentors and guided by our curriculum". Our Rockridge team presented and pitched months of research, business planning and app development to a panel of judges. Their app, *Quakesafe*, brings awareness, prepares and educates individuals and families about earthquakes. Our Rockridge Technovation team consisting of Laila S, Fiona A, Lucy R, Lauren S and Megan S placed 3rd and won a trip to Silicon Valley this summer for the 2018 World Pitch event. While in Silicon Valley they will meet other teams and women in technology. Congratulations to Ms. Kashani and the Rockridge team on their impressive showing!

This Wednesday, 40 Rockridge students in Grades 10-12 will be joining thousands of students across British Columbia at Youth Innovation Day at the #BCTECH Summit. Students will explore the wide range of education, training and career opportunities in our tech sector, and have the opportunity to meet with post-secondary institutions and companies who are creating the jobs of the future.
